PAPER - II

Full Marks-100

This paper will be divided into two groups. Group A shall consist of short answer type questions carrying 50 marks. A candidate shall be required to attempt only five questions carrying 10 marks each from a given choice of 10 questions. Group B shall consist of 50 marks. A candidate shall be required to attempt two long answer type questions carrying 25 marks each from given choice of six long questions. In group A the number of words in each answer shall be 150 and in Group B 500 each.
